Ian Ramsey Church of England Academy is a popular, over-subscribed academy for 11-16 pupils in Fairfield, Stockton-on-Tees. There are approximately 1175 pupils on roll with a pupil admission number of 237 in each year group.


Our Christian and British values underpin all our actions and I encourage you to visit each academy's website to see some excellent examples of how we live these values every day.

The merge will not affect the appointment of this post but will provide potential greater opportunities in the future.

Ian Ramsey CE Academy: Science Department

Science is an important area of our Academy and has been a focus of much investment over the past few years, particularly in terms of staffing.

As a core curriculum area, we aim to nurture real support and robust challenge. We aim to fostering a culture of high expectations and success in all regards, whilst continuing to be a major contributor to the school community and beyond. Learning lies at the very heart of our department, and we work hard to ensure that pupils are well motivated in lessons and are achieving to the best of their ability. We encourage pupils to be passionate about science, encouraging them to take a lifelong interest in them.



Science Curriculum

The science curriculum at Ian Ramsey CE Academy looks at the big ideas within science and re-visits each of these underpinning key concepts each year. This allows for a spiralling curriculum which allows for retrieval and practice before deepening the knowledge and understanding of each key concept. The department also offers OCR Health and Social Care as a Key Stage 4 option.

Our curriculum develops pupils' understanding and knowledge of key concepts that underpin everyday life, whilst promoting investigative skills that question and help pupils understand how the world works. During Years 7-9, science is taught as a combination of biology, chemistry, and physics. Science aims to spark interest and enjoyment of the natural phenomena around us. At GCSE, these specialisms as individual disciplines, however the key concepts continue to underpin the curriculum across the five years.

The GCSE Science course, following the Edexcel specification, deepens understanding of why science matters. All pupils follow the Combined Science specification and pupils have the choice to opt to follow the Triple Specification when the select their GCSE subjects, which start in Year 10. Through this specification pupils enjoy science and succeed in their studies. We recognise that every pupil is different. We ensure that we structure our course in a way that means pupils are best supported and challenged in

equal measure. Our curriculum support pupils across the five years to complete a range of core practicals which are designed to help bring science learning to life.

Science is fortunate to be grouped, alongside maths, with a different curriculum structure to the rest of the academy. In all year groups, pupils are banded into two bands which allows greater flexibility to group pupils. This also allows us to move pupils within the band to ensure they receive the support they need. Through our banding with maths, we can work closely with the maths department to share tracking and progress of pupils within and between the two core subjects.

At GCSE, pupils are taught in ability groups, with one group in each band being containing pupils who have opted to study Triple Science. This allows us to target teaching at GCSE to ensure that pupils are fully supported to succeed in their identified tier of entry to maximise their progress over time.

Science Enrichment

Pupils respond positively to the extra-curricular opportunities made available to them at Ian Ramsey CE Academy. Our pupils have enjoyed trips to the Kielder Observatory in Northumberland, Centre for Life, Discovery Museum and Tynemouth Aquarium as part of our aim to ensure science is for all, and to encourage science learning outside the classroom. We have also had external visitors into school, such as the portable observatory from Kielder, the BAE STEM Roadshow, the Royal Institute of Science, and representatives from the Royal Society of Chemistry.





We are continuing to develop the range of enrichment opportunities available to our pupils and see them as an essential part of our curriculum and crucial to pupils' understanding of science. We feel passionately about providing pupils with the experience of first-hand learning outside the classroom and ensuring every child builds upon their science capital.



Timetable allocation

The timetable is based on a two-week schedule, with five one-hour lessons per day. Science has 7 hours per fortnight at KS3 and 7 hours per fortnight at GCSE for Combined Science, with an additional five hours per fortnight for Triple Science.

Teaching rooms

In the Science Area, there are eight fully resourced labs, each with whiteboards, a projector, and a visualiser as standard. There are several fully equipped ICT rooms, and all pupils have access to a Chromebooks, which may be used as part of in-class learning or support independent study.
