# SUPPORT

We recognise that staff are our most important resource: they will have the biggest impact on the quality of education that our students receive. The Emmanuel staff body is an impressive group: well qualified, highly motivated and eminently hardworking. Colleagues are keen to continue developing their subject knowledge, pedagogical sophistication and classroom practice and the College is committed to doing all it can to support them in these endeavours.

The professional development of staff is a priority for us. All colleagues have access to a well-structured and high-quality CPL programme suited to the stage in their teaching journey and all heads of department have the chance to pursue an NPQLT qualification through a national provider.

As a line manager, you will play an important role in overseeing the wellbeing, as well as performance, of your staff. This is also the case for our heads of department:

you will have a line manager from the senior team who is deeply interested in you, your welfare as well as your development. Furthermore, the Head of Music benefits from the sense of collegiality and stimulation provided by membership of the College's Wider Leadership Team.

In addition to the normal remuneration package that includes a contributory pension scheme, company sick pay and maternity/paternity leave, Emmanuel staff enjoy a number of additional benefits. These include a daily lunch allowance, free use of our fitness suite, parking on the College grounds, as well as access to Care First, a free, independent and confidential resource available to employees that can help with all manner of needs.

There is a sense of real community amongst the Emmanuel staff body. Various social events sit alongside the long tradition of colleagues getting together after the College day to play football or netball – new players always hugely welcome!






# THE DEPARTMENT

The Creative Arts department comprises a large staff team teaching art, drama, graphics, LAMDA and music led by the Creative Arts and Events Lead. In addition, we are privileged to work with an experienced team of self-employed instrumental teachers who alongside our LAMDA teachers provide instrumental lessons and speech and drama lessons for almost a third of the student body. We are well equipped with two music classrooms with Sibelius suites and keyboards, two drama studios, three art classrooms and an auditorium space, which will be developed into a theatre. The department has established a firm tradition of expert classroom teaching as well as a well-respected and varied co-curricular and events programme that support student leadership and character development. We are supported by a forward-thinking senior team who value the arts and the opportunities for student leadership and character education.

All students in year 7 to 9 receive a curriculum music, drama and art lesson each week. In the arts we assesses students throughout each term, with the music assessments covering performance, composition and listening and appraising. We offer a varied and knowledge-rich curriculum including instrumental and vocal music, music for stage and screen, popular genre music and fusion music. We offer GCSE and A-Level courses in Art, Graphic Communication, Music and Drama. The Creative Arts and Events Lead has built on the work of previous heads of department to take the arts to a new level at Emmanuel College. Not only

is there a breadth of participation, but the ambitious nature of the curriculum, the events repertoire and the quality reached by our students are remarkable for a comprehensive school. This has been achieved as the result of a partnership between the arts teaching staff, Emmanuel colleagues and a large team of expert peripatetic tutors who share a collective vision of striving for excellence in the arts.

The arts form an important part of each day at Emmanuel College in our curriculum lessons, cocurricular groups, individual instrumental and LAMDA lessons and celebration assemblies. Music and Drama are an integral part of our events programme including our annual Carol Service and Presentation Evening that take place in the inspiring Hall One at The Glasshouse, Gateshead. Each year the Creative Arts department stages a breath-taking whole college production; these have included Les Miserables in 2019, the Greek tragedy Antigone in 2020, The Sound of Music in 2022 and Treasure Island in 2023. We also stage Christmas and Gala concerts each year to showcase the work of our musicians and ensembles. As a team we fully involve ourselves in these events and our music ensembles include Performance Choir and One Voice Choir, Jazz Band. Orchestra, Senior String Ensemble, Stage Door Drama Club, Art Clubs and LAMDA Public Speaking groups. We welcome musicians who thrive on working with ensembles, whether that be as a musical director for our production, choir leader or conducting or playing in our orchestra or jazz band.

The Emmanuel College curriculum is designed to engage all students, no matter their background, in a broad and balanced range of subjects. Highly effective teaching and learning principles share our practice and are embedded within every classroom.

An inspirational teacher, you will be able to teach at Key Stages 3, 4 and 5, offering GCSE and A-Level. In addition, you will lead on student recruitment for Instrumental Teaching, inspiring young musicians to develop their playing and engage in our co-curricular ensembles.

Our arts team are all well qualified and have industry or professional experience and we are looking for a musician who can offer the same. We welcome applications from leaders in the music field who are forward-thinking and experienced in a wide range of musical genres, but who also have a firm understanding and knowledge of classical music. We are seeking a music practitioner who is a motivated leader, adaptable and creatively inspiring to join a team that is committed to achieving academic excellence in their teaching of the arts to students of a wide ability range between the ages of 11 and 18.

Your motivation as a teacher will be the positive care and development of young lives and you will view children as individuals, gifted with unique abilities and potential regardless of background, ability or behaviour. A high

level of commitment to achieving academic excellence compounded by proficient subject pedagogy and high standards of delivery is a prerequisite for this post. You will have the highest expectations of students, refusing to believe that socio-economic deprivation or special educational needs should act as a barrier to success, and possessing a natural authority in the classroom. You will aspire to be an outstanding teacher, combining a mastery of your subject with strong relationships with young people, and having a confident grasp of the craft of the classroom.

There is no requirement that individual teachers should be Christians, but it is essential however that all staff understand and enthusiastically support our mission, ethos and values. There is a remarkable unity of purpose within the current staff team as individuals unite around our core beliefs that people are infinitely precious, gifted for a purpose and morally responsible. A desire to work with the most deprived in our communities and those with low academic starting points, as well as with the most able and those from more privileged backgrounds, is an essential prerequisite.

# THE ROLE

### Responsible to the Creative Arts and Events Lead for:

The rapid progress and exceptional academic achievement of all students in music with a particular emphasis on:

- being a visible example of our ethos, core virtues and leadership expectations that we hold;
- ensuring decisions are driven by quality of provision and student progress data;
- building a cohesive staff team where the development of staff as teachers (both subject knowledge and quality of instruction) and leaders (career development and succession planning) is a core part of your practice.

Implementing an exceptional music curriculum and providing opportunities for students to enjoy music beyond the school classroom with a particular emphasis on:

- ensuring the curriculum contains a clear progression from KS2 to KS5 and beyond and that all staff can articulate what is taught, why it is taught at that point in the curriculum and what it will lead to next for the students;
- implementing schemes of work that clearly define the substantive and disciplinary knowledge and vocabulary that students need to master and which lead to consistently exceptional teaching;
- building meaningful curriculum links to local industry as well as a wide range of enrichment opportunities to engage all groups of students and build their cultural capital.

Ensuring music teaching is consistently exceptional with a particular emphasis on:

- ensuring that schemes of work and lesson resources support consistently exceptional teaching and are regularly reviewed/improved through collaborative planning;
- leading regular quality assurance of effectiveness of teaching across the department, continually identifying examples of best practice to be disseminated and areas for improvement to be addressed through collaborative planning and support;
- creating a culture of reflective practice and improvement and professional dialogue across your team so that staff are motivated and supported to develop their own skills and subject knowledge, and to support each other.
