Newcastle Preparatory School boasts a history of nearly one hundred and forty years of educational excellence in the heart of Jesmond. Within our beautiful, historical building, we balance strong traditional roots with a thoroughly modern education and well-resourced facilities. The children of NPS are at the centre of all we do. Ensuring that children feel valued, cared for and safe within our warm and nurturing environment, enables each child to feel ready to learn. 
Mrs Natalie Johnson | Personalised Learning Assistant Head

Our beautiful school was founded in 1885 as the Newcastle Public Day School Company Limited in just one of the three Victorian townhouses the school now resides in. From the outset, NPS has prided itself on high academic achievement alongside a nurturing ethos.

Now, although the head teacher no longer resides in the school building, you will still find a distinctive family feel. Staff take great pride in getting to know each and every pupil, treating each as an individual and guiding them to reach their goals. Our strong history of achievements continues to thrive with children leaving at 11 with a wealth of offers to independent schools, many also offered scholarships on academic, sporting, musical and artistic merit.

As the only independent co-educational preparatory school in Tyneside, we are able to offer a unique education to children which puts them at the centre of all we do. Specialist teaching and facilities, enriching opportunities and a passion for learning mean that our pupils thrive.


The Structure

Nursery

In the September following their third birthday, children start First Steps Nursery. We offer morning or whole day sessions in our bespoke Nursery facilities.

Reception

The following school year children continue their Early Years education in three small classes in Reception. This year builds on the excellent foundations laid in Nursery.



Key Stage 2

For Years 3-6 we have two form classes per year group and a wealth of specialist teaching to provide a diverse and stimulating curriculum.



We continue to ensure that children have excellent staff to pupil ratios throughout Years 1 and 2, where they begin to explore with greater independence.



The benefits of an independent education are vast and impact far beyond the eight years pupils spend in our care.

The School Day

8am

With a flexible start, children are welcomed into school to attend clubs or take par in age-appropriate early room provision.

8.30am

Registration time allows children to begin their routine in a consistent way. Educational games and activities take place in form rooms alongside taking the register, assemblies and discussing the exciting day ahead.

gam

The day of timetabled lessons begins. Variety is key at NPS, so no two days of timetable are alike throughout the week.

Lunchtime

All children enjoy a delicious hot lunch served in our dining hall each day. Staff eat with the children to share informal conversation and model table manners. A range of meals are available to choose from with dietary requirements also catered for.

Playtimes

We value time for children to be active and socialise through play. All year groups have at least two playtimes per day, with Early Years having greater access to outdoor facilities.

3pm

From 3pm, we begin a staggered collection time for each year group. Our oldest children in Year 6 finish their learning at 4pm. Children of all ages are welcome to stay in school for late room.

4pm

Many extra-curricular clubs are available after school alongside late room provision which can be attended on a flexible basis.

5pm

For busy parents, we offer an extended late room until 5.30pm every day to allow for later collection. This is flexible and does not need to be booked in advance but does incur a small additional charge.

Children leave school each day full of ideas and tales of their adventures!

The Facilities

At the heart of our school is our stunning **Library**. This light, spacious and inspiring room is home to literary classics, a vast collection of non-fiction books and popular, current children's texts. Whether sharing a story around the tree chair or cosying up to read alone, this is a location loved by all children.

Our **Art Studio** is visited by children from Year 2 upwards to have specialist lessons with our Art Teacher. This highly creative space is permanently adorned with masterpieces which our children take great pride in.

The **Computing Suite** is always a popular location within our school. From an early age, children learn the basics of digital literacy which then rapidly turn into complex coding and computational thinking skills. We are generously equipped with a range of devices, robots and 3D printer.





For Key Stage 2 pupils, our **STEM Hub** enables children to carry out investigations using a range of specialised scientific and robotics equipment in a safe and unique environment using the expertise of our Science and Digital Learning Lead Teachers.

Children relish opportunities to visit the **Music Room**, where instruments are available to enrich the teaching by our Music Teacher. Children regularly participate in ensemble singing, composition and performance as part of the curriculum.

Our sizeable **Sports Hall** is used for PE and Games lessons with our specialist teachers and is fully equipped with gymnastic, trampolining and athletic apparatus. This facility is also home to our productions for parents at regular points throughout the year.



The Facilities

Used for play times, alongside PE and Games lessons, our large **Field** provides an open space for a variety of activities and sports pitches.

The hidden secret of our very own **Forest School** allows children to discover and develop outdoor skills in the safety of our bespoke provision. From Nursery to Year 6, our children are keen craftspeople, wildlife spotters and explorers.

For break times, children use the **Playground** which has a ball court, basketball hoops, climbing adventure equipment, a slide and a variety of puzzles and games to inspire play.





During Nursery and Reception, children use our **Early Years Playground** for outdoor learning opportunities. A vast array of resources are available to children including a climbing frame, scooters, construction materials, cosy play cottage and more.

Our traditional **Dining Hall** is where assemblies and singing practice are held, alongside being where children and staff enjoy a homecooked lunch each day.

The form **Classrooms** throughout NPS are light, bright and inspiring rooms in which to learn. Each teaching room is equipped with an interactive screen, beautiful size-appropriate furniture and high-quality resources.



The Extra-Curricular **Opportunities**



The Sport

Children at NPS are supported to lead healthy lives, with fitness, exercise and sport being an intrinsic part of this education.

Our specialist teachers provide a broad curriculum of sports which build on the skills taught each year using our excellent facilities. Each individual is encouraged to challenge themselves and participate in the range of activities including team games, individual events and competitive fixtures.

An extensive diary of fixtures and events are attended each year. Key Stage 1 children have opportunities to attend mini sporting festivals and competitions. Once in Key Stage 2, children swim weekly and regularly participate in tournaments and fixtures against other schools in the North East. NPS has long enjoyed many successes in sporting activities.

Staff reguarly attend sporting fixtures, including sports days.

The Arts

Creativity and expression are highly valued at NPS. Opportunities are created for children to explore and participate in many artistic endeavours throughout their years in the school.

All children will share a performance with their family during the school year which usually integrates drama, singing and often dancing too. This is always a heart-warming occasion where children can proudly demonstrate their talents and work collectively to produce outstanding shows. We also host an annual Carol Service before Christmas within which our older children sing and read as part of the traditional service.

During Art lessons, children will discover many different mediums and techniques; they are taught skills but also given freedom to create their own unique responses in the artworks.





Our hallways are filled with glorious pieces created by children, on display to the entire school. NPS regularly produce whole school responses and exhibitions based on themes which are relevant and accessible to pupils of all ages, these are then shared with families.

Within the wider community, our children participate in musical, artistic and dramatic activities. For example, working with local artists to create exhibitions and participating in concerts to name but a few.



The Destinations

The distinctive role of a preparatory school is that of preparing children for the next step in their education.



Our preparation for entrance exams takes place across the school through our vibrant and varied curriculum. However, in Upper Key Stage Two, children receive specialised assistance so that they are fully versed in all types of assessment.

Within the local area, we are fortunate to have superb choices for secondary education after NPS. The relationship between schools is excellent which allows families to make informed choices and for transitions to be smooth.

Children at NPS have a long history of being offered scholarships. This dates back to the first scholarship awarded in 1897 to a pupil; the princely sum of £50 to attend Durham School. We are proud to confirm that this tradition still continues with many awards and scholarships being offered each year for a range of merits, most recently academic, musical, sporting and artistic.
