- Committed to the highest standard of achievement for all students.
- Able to demonstrate leadership skills to support the development of staff.
- An outstanding communicator with excellent interpersonal skills.
- An enthusiastic team-player, self-motivated and committed to further professional development.
- Able to model outstanding planning, assessment and teaching in order to support staff in the department to achieve high quality teaching over time.

There is much to do, but the successful applicant will be fully supported by the Deputy Headteacher Quality of Education and Assistant Headteacher (AHT) Teaching and Learning.

Key aspects for the role in the first 12 months include:

- Working with the AHT to develop quality first teaching of Food, Health & Social Care and Textiles across the curriculum area.
- Supporting staff practice to develop more creative, engaging teaching.
- Raising achievement and supporting the improvements in outcomes across the curriculum area.

Churchill Community College believes in investing in our staff. Churchill is very much a community school, and whilst the community we serve is enormously proud and supportive of the school, a significant proportion of our students come from low income or deprived households, with well over 40% of our cohort eligible for the Pupil Premium

You do not need to be told how crucial this subject is to students in promoting creativity and developing their cultural capital and, for some students, the grade they achieve at Key Stage 4 can be transformative in terms of the opportunities it can provide them. Fostering a love of the subject with students will further support them to achieve success at Key Stage 5 and may lead to them choosing related subjects at University.

For these reasons we are looking for someone who instils in students the desire to learn and the aspiration they can achieve the very best they can. It is essential that the right candidate is an exceptional role model to both staff and students.
