Main Purpose:

You will be required to carry out the duties of a school teacher as set out in the current School Teachers' Pay and Conditions Document.

In addition to the duties above you will be required to demonstrate the leadership skills specified in the National Standards for Subject Leaders and to undertake the following responsibilities in relation to the post:

Generic Responsibilities:

- To undertake an appropriate programme of teaching in accordance with the duties of a standard scale teacher.
- To assist in the provision of an appropriately broad, balanced, relevant and differentiated curriculum for students studying in the curriculum area, in accordance with the aims of the school and the curricular policies determined by the Interim Executive Board (IEB), Executive Headteacher and Headteacher of the school.
- To assist the Head of Department in leading and developing this area.
- To assist in developing and enhancing the teaching practice of others.
- To monitor and support the overall progress and development of students as an assistant manager within the curriculum area and as a Form Tutor.
- To play a full part in the life of the school community, to support its distinctive mission and ethos and to encourage staff and students to follow this example.

Strategic:

- To assist in leading the development of appropriate syllabuses, resources, schemes of work and marking policies.
- The assist in the day-to-day management, control and operation of course provision within the department, including effective deployment of staff and physical resources.
- To assist in the monitoring and follow up of student progress.
- To assist in the management of the department, and to ensure that the activities of the department reflect the needs of students within the subject area, College Improvement Plan/Departmental Development Plan and the aims and objectives of the College.
- To ensure that Health and Safety Policies and practices, including Risk Assessments, throughout the department are in-line with National requirements and are updated where necessary, therefore liaising with the College's Health and Safety Manager.

- To maintain accreditation with the relevant examination and validating bodies.
- To promote and develop appropriate extra-curricular and community activities within the department.

Staffing:

- To work with the Head of Department to ensure that staff development needs are identified and that appropriate programmes are designed to meet such needs.
- To contribute to Personal Development Review and to act as reviewer for a group of staff within the designated department.
- To promote teamwork and to motivate staff to ensure effective working relations.
- To ensure the effective efficient deployment of classroom support.
- To participate in the school's ITT programme.

Quality Management:

- To ensure the effective operation of quality control systems.
- To assist with setting targets within the department and to work towards their achievement.
- To establish common standards of practice within the department and develop the effectiveness of teaching and learning styles in all relevant curriculum areas within the department.
- To contribute to the school procedures for lesson observation.
- To implement school quality procedures and to ensure adherence to those within the department.
- To participate in the monitoring and evaluation of the curriculum area/department in line with agreed school procedures including evaluation against quality standards and performance criteria.
- To implement modification and improvement where required within the relevant curriculum area.
- To ensure the maintenance of accurate and up-to-date information concerning the relevant curriculum area on the management information system.
- To produce reports within the quality assurance cycle.
- To identify appropriate courses and coordinate exam entries within the department.

Pastoral Support:

- To monitor and support the overall progress and development of students within the curriculum area
- To monitor student attendance together with students' progress ensuring that follow-up procedures are adhered to and that appropriate action is taken where necessary.
- To act as Form Tutor and carry out the duties associated with the role as outlined in the generic job description.
- To implement the Behaviour Management system in the department so that effective learning can take place.

Other Specific Duties:

- To support the school in meeting its legal requirements for worship.
- To promote actively the school's corporate policies.
- To continue personal development as agreed.
- To actively engage in the staff review and development process.
- To undertake any other duty as specified by STPCB not mentioned in the above.
