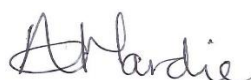

Newcastle High School for Girls is the North East of England's only independent girls' day school for pupils aged 3-18, and a leading choice for families seeking an outstanding education for girls.

Founded in 2014 through the merger of two long-established schools, NHSG combines state-of-the-art facilities with an educational heritage stretching back more than 150 years. This blend of forward-thinking practice and deep-rooted tradition underpins an education that is academically ambitious, carefully structured and firmly focused on the needs of girls.

We are proud to be part of the Girls' Day School Trust (GDST), a family of leading girls' schools across the UK. As a GDST school, NHSG benefits from the strength, stability and shared expertise of the Trust, alongside the opportunity to collaborate with colleagues and pupils nationally, while retaining our own distinctive character and strong local identity.

We are an all-through school, educating around 700 girls across our Junior and Senior Schools, supported by approximately 150 dedicated staff. With around 250 girls in the Junior School and 450 in the Senior School, including over 100 in the Sixth Form, our size enables us to offer a broad and challenging curriculum alongside genuinely personalised support. Girls are well known as individuals, and strong relationships sit at the heart of a friendly, purposeful and welcoming community.

Our Junior and Senior Schools are based on separate campuses, around a mile apart, in the leafy suburbs of Jesmond and Sandyford. This role is based at our Senior School campus.

Overview – Minibus Chaperone



The role of Minibus Chaperone is to accompany and supervise pupils travelling on school transport to ensure their pastoral wellbeing, comfort and health and safety are taken care of throughout each journey. You will be required to ensure their safe passage on school transport and to keep registers to ensure all children in your care have been picked up and dropped off safely to their intended destinations.

You will also be expected to liaise with parents and carers in a friendly, polite, courteous and professional manner at all times, as you would be representing the school in those interactions. You will, on occasions, be expected to liaise with parents regarding the collection of their children, so will be required to develop relationships with parents and carers to foster links between home and school. Communication with the school is also key with regards to raising any concerns in connection with health and safety, safeguarding and pastoral care to maintain the school's duty of care and to promote the wellbeing of our pupils at all times.

Our School is a very popular choice at all ages with girls joining us from most parts of the Tyne and Wear metropolitan area as well as areas further afield in Durham, Northumberland, the Tyne Valley, the Borders and Teesside.

Girls who attend NHSG are bright, enthusiastic, eager to learn and have high aspirations. Our public examination results are consistently outstanding, and girls go on to study a wide range of subjects at prestigious universities in the UK and abroad.
